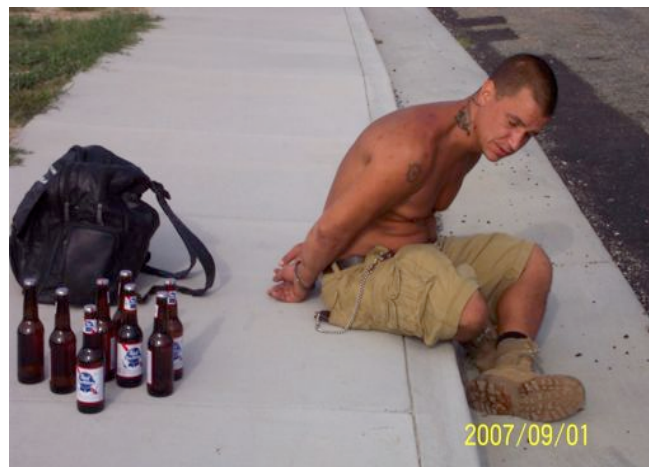

Significant Arrests:

On September 1st, while patrolling the Oregon Hill area, Officer Gary Ellis arrested a “gentleman” for both drinking and urinating in public. He photographed him with all of the beer he had in his backpack. On September 6th, MoJo’s called to report a burglary. They advised the officer that they had also had a burglary in the early morning hours of September 1st. Beer was stolen on both occasions. Once Officer Ellis viewed the tapes – he immediately recognized the suspect as the “gentleman” that he arrested on September 1st and recognized the stolen merchandise as the same brand of beer he had photographed. The officer obtained warrants and began his search for the suspect. By the time he ended his tour of duty; the suspect was arrested and charged with 3 burglaries to MoJo’s.



On September 1st, Officer Al Joyner responded to a call for a larceny from auto. The victim gave a good description of the suspect and the officer was able to detain him in just a few minutes and retrieve the victim's satellite radio. During his investigation a lady came running up and stated that the suspect was wearing a shirt that was stolen from her car the night prior. The suspect was charged with Grand Larceny for the theft that day and the Precinct Detective obtained a warrant charging the suspect with the prior larceny.

On September 9th, Officer Robert Jamison initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle traveling westbound on Broad Street because of inoperable brake lights. The driver initially gave the officer a wrong name and date of birth. Further investigation revealed that the driver was wanted in 4 different states on 27 outstanding warrants. The suspect was arrested without incident and charged with an additional two misdemeanors.

On September 17th, Officer Todd Jones responded to a fight call on Leigh Street. The juvenile was arrested without incident and a gun was seized. When he was brought to the precinct for questioning and paperwork, it was determined that there was also an indictment on file for the suspect for a narcotics violation. He was charged with two felonies and one misdemeanor.

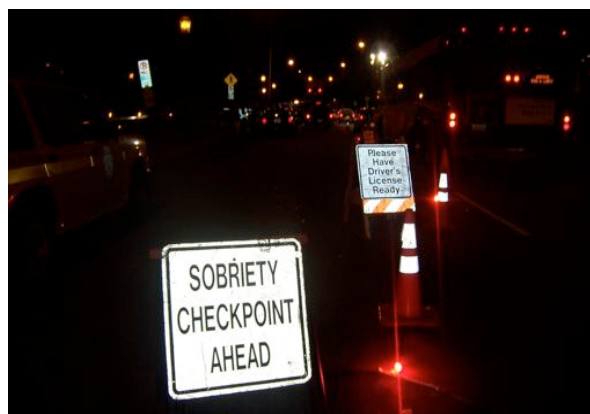
Sector 413 Robbery Initiative:

August 29th we kicked off a robbery initiative to fight the increase of robberies in the Oregon Hill and VCU areas. The initiative ended on September 29th with a decrease of 75% in robberies in that area.

Joint DUI Check Point – VCUPD and RPD

Sergeant Shane Barlow worked with VCU Police to organize a joint DUI checkpoint at 1000 W. Main St. to make our streets safer. The checkpoint was conducted on September 29th and was a huge success. 493 cars entered the checkpoint area. Results are as follows:

- 4 felonies
- 12 misdemeanors
- 53 traffic summons
- 2 warrants served
- 6 DUI arrests
- Cocaine, marijuana and U.S. Currency seized.



Crime Watch Tip:

Larcenies from automobiles have been an ongoing problem in the City of Richmond. NO neighborhood is immune to this problem. This is a crime of opportunity. PLEASE- PLEASE remember to take your valuables inside with you!! Do not consider your things secured if they are merely locked in your car. Something as small as loose change will make you a target so you can imagine the excitement when the criminal sees the IPOD or the laptop.

Sgt. Jean-Guy LeGouffe and Officer Robert Kleinholz have started an initiative to help reduce theft from autos. Officers from their platoon are walking thru neighborhoods and around VCU checking your cars and passing out flyers to remind you to harden the target.
