Significant Arrests

- ? **Officer *Jill Simons*, of Evening Shift, wasn't content to just take a report when a merchant called her to investigate the return of some bad checks. She followed up through phone calls and meeting with the individuals involved. Her investigation led to the arrest of an individual for felony charges.**
- ? **Officers *Ken Payne and Kaneka McQueen* of Day Shift were able to follow up on information provided by the proprietor of a local hotel in relation to a drug complaint. Their investigation led to an arrest for narcotics.**
- ? **Officers *David Gray and Brady McWhirter* of Evening Shift were called to investigate a complaint of a disorderly female. When they arrived, they found a woman outside dressed inappropriately for the weather. They were able to check the apartment where the woman came from. There they investigated further and found drugs were being used. Their thorough handling of this call led to narcotics arrests.**
- ? **Detective *Sharon Mayo* of the Special Investigations Unit, while working a reversal operation in the 2300 block of Chamberlayne Avenue, made an arrest for solicitation.**
- ? **Officers *Bourne and Simons* of Evening Shift were investigating a call of a barking dog when they noticed several subjects lurking in a nearby alley. They checked the subjects and found he had outstanding warrants. When they arrested and searched him they found crack cocaine. Thanks Lassie...good girl.....**
- ? **Officers *Simons and Picard* of Evening Shift were following up on complaints of persons using drugs in the laundry room of an apartment complex when they walked in on two persons in the process of smoking crack cocaine. Two arrests were made. The spin cycle was interrupted.**
- ? **Officers *Matt McHugh and Joy Norwood* of Day Shift, with the assistance of Detective *George Wade* were able to apprehend a subject in the process of stealing copper from a vacant home.**
- ? **Officers of the *4th Precinct Focus Mission Team* developed information leading to the issuance of a search warrant for a residence at 3012 Garland Avenue resulting in the seizure of a significant amount of marijuana, six firearms and felony arrests.**

- ? **Sergeant *Jean-Guy LeGouffe* and Officers *Stone, Simons and Klienholtz* of Evening Shift developed a plan to use a “decoy car” to catch suspects stealing from vehicles in the Carver Community. Their diligence and initiative led to the arrest of a subject for grand larceny. **GOOD WORK!!!****

- ? **Our officers conducted 95 field interviews with suspicious individuals during the month of November 2007. They made 72 arrests, issued 158 traffic summons and handled 1805 calls for service in Sector 412.**

Crime stopper Tips

The Holiday Season is here. Shopping trips and presents bring crime prevention advice with them. Be alert to your surroundings while shopping and traveling back and forth. Try not to overload yourself with packages. Remember to turn on porch lights at night and to be vigilant. Call us (646-4105) to keep an eye on your home if you'll be going away.

I'm asking for some help in raising the level of vigilance by people in our neighborhoods in response to recent incidents in which heat pumps and a/c units have been stolen from vacant / for sale homes in North Richmond. Please pass the word to your neighbors to call us if they see any suspicious activity or vehicles around any homes like this in their areas. Don't forget to jot down license plate numbers too if you can do it safely. We're hoping that with your help we can put the copper and aluminum thieves behind (un-recycled steel) bars for the holidays.

Try not to start up your car in the morning and leave it, unattended, to warm up. Many cars are stolen that way every year. It will warm up enough to drive after only a minute or so and driving it while it warms up enough to work the heater will save valuable gas.

Electronic items are stolen from motor vehicles every day. Cell phones and IPODs are popular. If you use one of these in your car, remember to lock it in the trunk or take it with you when you leave the vehicle.

At the end of November 2007, motor vehicle thefts were down 28% for the year. Residential burglaries were down 34% and burglaries to sheds and outbuildings were down 35%. Thefts from motor vehicles were down 3%. We still have plenty of "Clubs" to give away. Call us at 4th Precinct (646-4105) to arrange to come by and pick up yours.
