## *What's going on in your neighborhood?*

### **Oregon Hill**

Oregon Hill crime was up 50% from 2007 – 4 to 6 crimes. 3 of the 6 crimes occurred in the 200 block of S. Cherry Street (A car, a bike and some plants were stolen.) Residents (in that block especially) should report any suspicious activity. There was one other bike, wheels from a car and license plates stolen in your neighborhood.

### **Monroe Ward**

September was a bad month for Monroe Ward. Crime was up 92% - 14 to 27 crimes. Robberies, Auto Thefts and Thefts from Cars were the biggest problems. We had 4 robberies in this neighborhood – all occurred at night between 10:00pm and 3:15am. We are following up on some leads in these robberies and have made an arrest on one of them. Please remember to stay alert to your surroundings, never travel alone, always lock your cars and never leave your valuables in your car.

### **Jackson Ward**

September was a good month for Jackson Ward as far as violent crime was concerned – we had none. But it was another bad month for property crime. Shoplifting and Thefts from Cars were our biggest crimes. I am really not so concerned with the Shoplifting because Rite Aid has great security and they are making arrests on almost all shoplifting cases – my biggest concern is that residents are continuing to leave valuables in plain view in their cars. I can just about promise you that if you leave a GPS or an IPOD in your car – when you get back – it will not be there. We can not be on every block all the time – we really need your help on this. Please don't leave valuables in your cars and please call us if you see anything suspicious.

## *Crime Watch Tips*

### **Larceny from auto and auto theft**

#### **Reducing the Opportunity – Larcenies from Autos**

- Park in well-lighted areas
- Park in well-traveled areas
- Lock your doors.
- Do not leave valuables in the car!!!!
- Mark or slash inspection stickers and city decals,
- Put valuables in the trunk before you get to your destination.
- Do not use your glove box as a “safe”.
- DO NOT LEAVE ANYTHING IN PLAIN VIEW (toll change, food, gym bag, etc.)
- DO NOT LEAVE THE MOUNT TO YOUR GPS AFFIXED TO YOUR WINDSHIELD!!! (The criminal will guess that there is probably a GPS in your car if he/she sees the mount.)
- DO NOT LEAVE YOUR ELECTRONICS PLUGGED IN!! (Recently we have had several cars broken into with IPODs or GPSs hidden under the seat or in the glove box but they were still plugged in – criminals are looking in your cars)

#### **Reducing the Opportunity – Auto Thefts**

- Lock your car. Most cars are unlocked when they are stolen.
- Never leave your car to warm up unattended.
- Park in well-lighted areas.
- Park in well-travelled areas.
- Do not leave the registration in the car. Carry it with you.
- USE AN ANTI-THEFT DEVICE. (The criminal will move on to the next car if your car appears to be the harder target.)

#### **Anti-theft Devices**

Below is a listing of some of the many devices on the market that may help to prevent your car from being stolen:

- Alarms
- Steering wheel locking devices
- Column collars
- Shut-off switches



### *Good News*

I know that the area surrounding 2<sup>nd</sup> and Broad is a problem area and I want you to know that we are continuing to work on it. Just between the 2 Officer Bike Team and the 4 Officer HOPE Unit – there were 8 felony arrests, 43 misdemeanor arrests, 3 warrants served and 14 truants picked up in that area in September. That does not include the numerous arrests, walking and bike hours, etc. that was put in by the Mounted Unit and 4<sup>th</sup> Precinct Officers. We will continue to work on that area and are planning a Community Walk in that area for November 8<sup>th</sup> – more details to follow.

Oregon Hill has been experiencing a terrible problem with Graffiti around the Overlook Area. The HOPE Unit spent 160 hours in that area over a week's time doing surveillance. Unfortunately our "artists" did not strike during the week and they were unable to make any arrests. Graffiti is a tough crime to make arrests on because it is so random. Please keep your eyes out for suspicious activity and give us a call if you see anything that does not feel right to you.
